WIND FARM

**Waddi Wind Farm will deliver 108MW of renewable energy, enough to power 68,000 homes. Construction of the project is now underway, bringing employment and broader benefits to the region.**

Since our last newsletter in December 2025, our construction partners have been busy mobilising on-site to complete early civil works.

Meanwhile, our teams have been out in the community, working with local groups to determine benefit sharing arrangements during construction.

## Construction update

Since February, our team has been on-site completing early civil works. This includes preparing a site compound and an area for the concrete batching plant, as well as starting works on internal roads.

Western Power has also been completing enabling works for the transmission line that will connect the project to the existing grid.

We understand that construction activity can cause disruption and we appreciate your patience. While most construction will take place on private property, you may notice a temporary increase in traffic on Brand Highway near the project.

## Benefit sharing update

We have been working with local stakeholders to identify projects for funding during construction, including:

- Dandaragan Community Resource Centre
- Dandaragan Primary School
- Badgingarra Primary School
- Dandaragan Community Centre

We are proud to share the projects below have been approved for funding.

### Dandaragan Community Resource Centre

Value: \$48,000

Supply and installation of a solar energy system and backup generator to address frequent and disruptive power outages affecting the community.

### Dandaragan Primary School

Value: \$29,000

Supply and installation of new water tanks to collect, transfer and use rainwater in the gardens.

### Badgingarra Primary School

Value: \$5,000

Contribution to the supply and installation of a mobile booster antenna to improve phone reception.

### Dandaragan Community Centre

Value: \$2,700

Contribution to the purchase of new accessible seating for older residents.

## Our work to reduce impacts to the Carnaby's Black Cockatoo

We have worked hard to reduce impacts to the Carnaby's Black Cockatoo. These measures include:

- reducing the number of turbines from 57 to 18
- increasing turbine height to avoid cockatoo flight paths
- engaging qualified ecologists to undertake studies into cockatoo behaviour across the site and local area.

We have also committed to revegetating 17 hectares of cockatoo foraging habitat and installing seven nest boxes to encourage breeding in the local area.
