Topic		Discussion		
1.	Welcome, Introductions and apologies	Peter Gordon, CCC Chair, introduced himself and informed the committee that he had been appointed as the new independent chair of the CCC.		
		Tilt Renewables – Daved Owen, Federica Frew, and Clive Londt introduced themselves as Tilt Renewables representatives.		
		Community members – the community members in attendance introduced themselves and explained their history and service as members of the CCC.		
		Snowy-Monaro Regional Council introduced themselves, and the committee particularly welcomed the mayor's presence.		
		Apologies (Howard Charles, Fiona Taylor, Snowy Monaro CEO).		
2.	Tilt Renewables presentation and project update	Representatives of Tilt Renewables and Squadron Energy explained the handover between the two proponents. David Laing is handing the on-site management to Clive Londt and Federica Frew will be the Community and Stakeholder Engagement contact for the community.		
		Tilt Renewables representatives gave a briefing on the company and an update on the performance of the wind farm. Performance of the wind farm saw week on week generation of about 6,400MWh – average capacity factor 34%.		



		Compliance update: Internal Safety and Environmental audits took place on site on 23 and 24 June.	
		Much discussion was focussed on the plans for Stage 2 of the wind farm. Tilt have been focusing on the transition of operations however are reviewing Stage 2 to fully understand the scope, design, and conditions of the project approvals and will prepare a brief to the committee on the plans for Stage 2 at the next CCC meeting.	
3.	Discussion and additional agenda items	Substantial funds have been allocated through the Community Enhancement Fund (charter discussed later).	
		Each of the community representatives expressed a strong desire to re-examine the criteria for allocating the Community Enhancement Fund. The chair noted that this CCC has no direct role on the management of the fund. The committee appreciated the fact that the project approval conditions specified the means by which the fund was delivered.	
		Luke O'Sullivan from Council briefed the committee on the background to the fund and how amalgamation of regional councils has impacted grant management. The community representatives all commented on the widespread interest local people had in the fund and how it was managed.	
		It was generally understood that the criteria related to the location of the grant beneficiary was fundamentally important and will continue to be relevant in the grant assessment process. Council stated they are open to adding a location-based priority clause into the charter and would discuss further with Tilt and the Community Enhancement Fund Committee (Action item #2). Tilt agreed to bring these matters to the council and the Community Enhancement Fund committee and the keep the CCC informed on the matter and keep on the agenda for the CCC. (Action Item #3)
