3.41.01	KW advised she had contacted TfNSW regarding the need for a tourist sign to the Daydream Mine at the intersection with the windfarm road. No response to date.	

<b>4</b>	<b>Project Update – Dr Elizabeth Beavis, Asset Manager, TILT Renewables</b>	
	<p>EB provided the following update:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Substation annual maintenance completed in October</li> <li>2. Reliability of the wind farm is improving following annual maintenance this year.</li> <li>3. Blade repairs are continuing.</li> <li>4. Major components are replaced as required – currently working on a gearbox exchange, finding a low wind period has been challenging.</li> <li>5. Multiple Transgrid outages are occurring to support construction of project Energy Connect in NSW, as well as low electricity prices mean sometimes the turbines are not spinning.</li> <li>6. Energy production since the start of January 2025 was about 500GWh. This is enough to power over 68,000 households for a year.</li> </ol>	Note
<b>5</b>	<b>Silverton Community Enhancement Fund &amp; Sponsorships</b>	
5.41.1	<p>KW advised to following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. \$17,500 again will be available for the 25/26 financial year.</li> <li>2. One completed application received.</li> <li>3. Silverton Village Committee application proposed Greening our Outback.</li> <li>4. Project proposes the purchase and planting of 30 native trees across the village with the following objectives: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Enhance local biodiversity by planting native species suited to the climate and soil conditions</li> <li>• Reduce the rural heat effect through increased canopy cover and natural shading</li> <li>• Engage the community in hands-on environmental action, encouraging long-term stewardship of green spaces</li> <li>• Improve town amenity by beautifying public spaces and creating a welcoming environment for residents and tourists.</li> </ul> </li> <li>5. IG confirmed that the project brings benefits to the Silverton Village and surrounds.</li> <li>6. There are no known risks and extra funds are available to complete the project this financial year. Propose to engage the community through a working bee to undertake the project. Work is proposed to commence Q2 2026.</li> <li>7. Tilt conformed they were happy to approve the project and will commence necessary approvals.</li> </ol>	Note
