Tilting towards the future.

The Palmer Wind Farm will help secure reliable energy for Australia generating up to 288MW of clean energy when constructed. That's enough to power up to 142,000 South Australian homes.

The local community will see new jobs, investment and \$7+ million in community benefit funding.

The project is located between Palmer and Tungkillo, approximately 70 kilometers from Adelaide on Peramangk Country.

Palmer Wind Farm is now under construction and expected to be completed in mid 2028.

Project update

Construction on site formally commenced this week. The first activities occurring are setting up the site offices and creating two permanent site access points on Randell Road. Until the site access points are completed, we will be using the SA Water entry point.

Once an on-site base and two new access points are established, an internal road network will be created and used to link up the turbines and substations. Creating the internal road network will involve digging, clearing and eventually blasting. We will try to remove rocks with machines, if this is not possible blasting will be used.

The construction crew onsite will grow over the next few months as activities ramp up.

As construction activities increase, there will be more traffic in the area and changes to traffic conditions on Randell Road. Please see the next page for more information about traffic including changes to Randell Road.

The project will use SMS notifications to notify the local community when:

- Blasting activities might be heard near you;
- Oversize and Overmass vehicle deliveries start;
- There are unexpected changes or impacts through construction.

Construction details

It will take approximately two years to build the Palmer Wind Farm.

What can you expect to hear and see?

Working hours

Monday to Saturday, 7am to 7pm.

- Any works occurring outside these hours is considered 'out of hours' works. Examples of when 'out of hours' work could be needed are activities that can't be stopped until they are finished (e.g., concrete pours, turbine lifts).

Construction activities

- You may hear concrete batching, excavation, rock breaking, blasting, construction vehicles moving and machinery on site.
- We will take practical steps throughout construction to minimise noise and dust impacts.
- Noisy activities will be located away from sensitive areas where possible.

Traffic

Increased traffic will start in mid-2026 before Over Size and Over Mass (OSOM) deliveries of turbine parts commence in 2027.

- Deliveries will use state highways and enter site from entry points on Randell Road.
- Vehicles will move around site via the access roads we build. There will only be a limited number of other vehicles using local roads where needed.
- We will actively manage driver behaviour to ensure the safety of the local community. All project drivers will be required to comply with speed limits, road rules and approved traffic management plans.
- Large deliveries of turbine parts (OSOM) will be planned to avoid school drop off hours of 8-9am on weekdays.

Traffic changes

Vehicle types

Wind farm construction generates a lot of traffic when materials, machinery and turbines are delivered to site.

There are three types of vehicles you will see during construction:

- **Light vehicles**, such as utes, used to move people and smaller goods around site.
- **Heavy vehicles**, such as semi-rigid trucks, used to transport larger materials to site. For example, concrete.
- **Large trucks, known as Over Size Over Mass (OSOM) vehicles**, used to move large components to site such as turbine blades.

The following table outlines the key vehicle movement times by vehicle type. Exemptions may be considered on a case-by-case basis, if required and subject to approval by the relevant authorities.

TYPE OF VEHICLE	TIMES
LIGHT VEHICLES	• Standard construction hours are Monday - Saturday 7am to 7pm • Workforce movement times are generally 6:00am to 7:30am and 5pm to 7:30pm
HEAVY VEHICLES	• Generally standard construction hours which are Monday - Saturdays 7am to 7pm
OSOM DELIVERIES	• Randell Road which is a state highway will be used for all OSOM deliveries. • We will do our best to arrive to site: ◦ Before 8am – aiming between 7am and 8am. ◦ Or after 9am – likely between 9.30am and 12.30pm.

Randell Road traffic changes

Two new access points need to be built on Randell Road between Palmer and Tungkillo to allow our vehicles to safely enter the site with large equipment. BMD is building these site access points in mid to late 2026.

Randell Road is a state highway with an existing large volume of heavy vehicles. The current speed limit is 100km/h between Palmer and Tungkillo. To ensure the safety of everyone while the new entry/exit points are built and during wind farm construction, speeds near the new entry/exit points on Randell Road will be reduced. These speed limit changes will be in place for the duration of construction from mid-2026 to mid-2028. Importantly, there will message boards that will tell you the speed limit as you approach and we will provide notice before speed changes commence.

Once onsite, vehicles will move within the wind farm site using the new internal road network.

Sharing the road with heavy vehicles

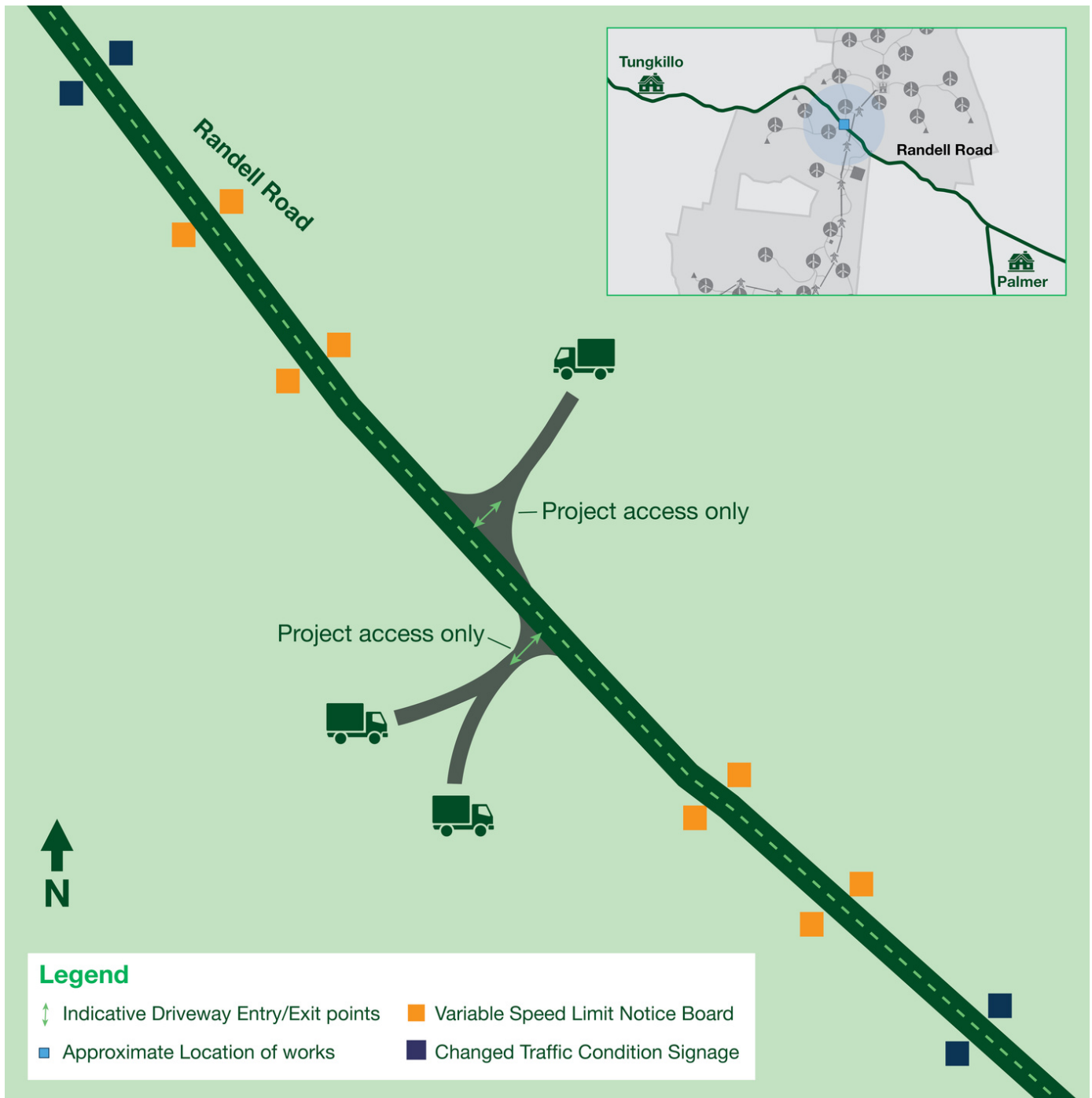
- Keep in mind that due to their weight and size, heavy vehicles take a lot longer to stop, so please give them space.
- Heavy vehicles can also have bigger blind spots, so truck drivers may not be able to see you.
- Trucks also have a much wider turning circle, so please be careful when driving next to or behind a truck, especially at intersections.

Speed changes apply during construction (from mid-2026 for approximately two years) approximately 3km from the Palmer township, towards Tungkillo.

Please always check the electronic signage to determine the speed:

- Monday to Saturday:
 - 6am to 9am: 60km/hour (When most vehicles are entering the site)
 - 9am to 7pm: 80km/hour (Construction hours)
 - 7pm to 6am: 100km/hour (Outside of work hours)
 - As needed: 40km/hour (High volume of heavy vehicle and OSOM movement)
- Sundays and non-construction days: 100km/hour

Please note: OSOM deliveries will arrive before 8am or after 9am, likely between 9.30am and 12.30pm on weekdays. OSOM deliveries will begin in 2027.

During the development of these plans and assessments, we engaged with a range of stakeholders including the Country Fire Service, Mid Murray Council, Department of Infrastructure and Transport, Department for Housing and Urban Development, Environmental Protection Authority, Department for Environment and Water, Bureau of Meteorology and the Murraylands and Riverland Landscape Board.

The State Planning Commission is satisfied that we have met all our pre-construction planning conditions, and construction can commence.

On Friday 3 July, Tilt Renewables, BMD and their subcontractors were privileged to participate in a Welcome to Country and Smoking Ceremony with the Peramangk Aboriginal Corporation.

Tilt Renewables is committed to creating positive First Nations outcomes through the Palmer Wind Farm. This includes employment and subcontracting opportunities during construction and a \$1 million First Nations Training and Capacity Building Fund over the first five years of the project.

Community Consultative Committee (CCC)

Tilt Renewables is establishing a Community Consultative Committee (CCC) for the Palmer Wind Farm for the construction period 2026-2028.

The committee will bring together community representatives, Tilt Renewables, BMD Group (construction partner) and an independent chair to support open, two-way communication throughout the construction period.

The CCC is designed to support open discussion and feedback to help inform the project. While it doesn't make decisions, it plays an important role in sharing community information and perspectives so we can manage construction impacts as best as possible.

This is a great opportunity to represent your community and help ensure local perspectives are heard, and that everyone in the community can:

- Stay informed about the project;
- Ask questions and raise any concerns;
- Share local knowledge and insights;
- Provide feedback directly to the project team.

The Palmer Wind Farm will distribute more than \$7 million in community benefits across the 30+ year life of the project. This amounts to \$230,000 every year, which will be adjusted by CPI. Community Fund

The \$70,000 Palmer Wind Farm Community Fund aims to support small, charitable and not-for-profit organisations that offer broad, long-term benefit to the community. It is designed to support the community within 20kms of the Palmer Wind Farm with a focus on the communities of Palmer and Tungkillo.

Adult Learning Fund

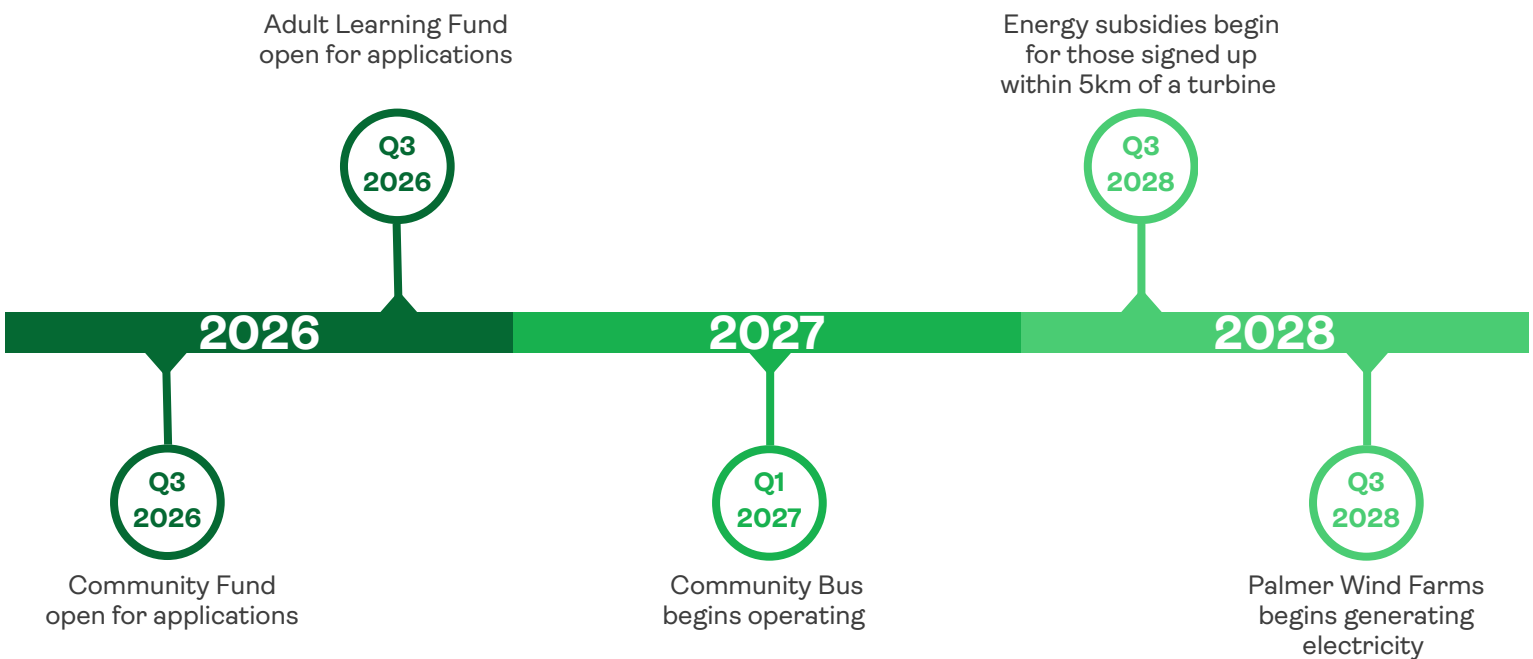
The Palmer Wind Farm Adult Learning Fund aims to support people aged 21 or above living in Palmer, Tungkillo or the surrounding areas, who have been offered a place at an Australian university, TAFE Institute or apprenticeship and require additional support to complete their studies.

The scholarship program supports expenses which will enable the recipient to complete their studies - accommodation costs, childcare costs, course costs, study-related materials/equipment, textbooks, tutoring and /or education related travel (within Australia).

Applications are welcome from across the region, but people living closer to Palmer and Tungkillo will be prioritised.
