IG advised the current projects had not commenced but are still works in progress 3. Proposal: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Challenges asking for applications every year and pressure to finish every project within a year. • Instead could provide the money directly to the Silverton Village Committee to be delivered by them for the benefit of the Silverton Community. • This would reduce the application burden and allow the money to build a little. • Tilt would still ask for updates on how and what the money was spent on. • Allocations would continue to increase by CPI 4. 	<p>Broken Hill Bypass Road</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The bypass road was created to allow multiple loads of turbine blades and other large equipment to travel to the Silverton Wind Farm without travelling through Broken Hill. • The wind farm was completed in 2020 and large deliveries are rare. Therefore, the bypass road is no longer needed day-by-day. • The road requires a lot of maintenance to be safe and useable, so Tilt Renewables has made the decision to close the road. • The road will be rehabilitated to its original condition and any necessary signage will be installed telling people its closed. • Tilt Renewables will keep the Crown Lands Licence over the road in case it is needed again in the future. • Tilt Renewables has engaged with Crown Lands and Council about the road and neither have expressed interest in taking over the road and are comfortable with the rehabilitation and closure. <p>CCC Review</p> <p>KW advised Tilt Renewables are working with the NSW Department of Planning to review a few of their long standing CCC's. The result may be that there may no longer be a requirement to have a formal CCC with an Independent Chair.</p> <p>Tilt Renewables would still propose to meet with the community and engage bi-annually.</p> <p>Would there be any local concerns if this were to occur?</p> <p>IG & PP both felt the community has a good working relationship with Tilt renewables and such a move would not be a problem.</p> <p>GW agreed that the proposal would be an agreeable outcome and supports the action if the DPHI moves in that direction.</p> <p>Outback Energy</p> <p>KW advised that Tilt Renewables is considering an Outback Energy Project as a game changing prospect for Australia offering up to 10GW of renewable energy. The project would be located in the heart of Australia with options to connect to NSW, South Australia, Queensland or Victoria.</p> <p>Link to the presentation.</p>
